Jesus heals Aeneas & resurrects Tabitha through Peter

Acts 1:8 You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."

Acts 9: 32 Now as Peter was traveling through all those regions, he came down also to the saints who lived at Lydda.

- **Acts 8:40** Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he kept preaching the gospel to all the cities until he came to Caesarea.
- There he found a man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden eight years, for he was paralyzed had the palsy.
- 34 Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you; get up and make collect your bed." Immediately he got up.
 - **Luke 5:24** {N.B.: Jesus speaking} But, so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins," He said to the paralytic "I say to you, get up, and pick up your stretcher and go home."
 - John 5:8 Jesus said to him, "Get up, pick up your pallet and walk."



- 35 And all who lived at Lydda and Sharon saw him, and they turned to the Lord.
- 36 Now in Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha (which translated in Greek is called Dorcas); this woman was abounding with deeds of kindness and charity which she continually did.
- 37 And it happened at that time that she fell sick and died; and when they had washed her body, they laid it in an upper room.
- 38 Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, having heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him, imploring him, "Do not delay in coming to us."

- 39 So Peter arose and went with them. When he arrived, they brought him into the upper room; and all the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing all the tunics and garments that Dorcas used to make while she was with them.
- 40 But Peter sent them all out and knelt down and prayed, and turning to the body, he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter, she sat up.
- 41 And he gave her his hand and raised her up; and calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive.
 - Mark 5:40-41 {N.B.: the passage refers to Jesus} Putting them all out... Taking the child by the hand, He said to her, "Talitha kum!" (which translated means, "Little girl, I say to you, get up!").
- 42 It became known all over Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.
 - **Romans 3:20** By the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in His sight; for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin.
 - Jeremiah 17:9 "The heart is more deceitful than all else than anything else and is desperately sick damaged; who can understand it?
 - **Ephesians 2:1** You were dead in your trespasses and sins
 - Galatians 3:24 The Law has become our tutor {literally, "child teacher"} to lead us to Christ, so that we may be justified by faith.
 - Acts 1:1-2 The first account I composed, Theophilus, about all that Jesus began to do and teach, until the day when He was taken up to heaven, after He had by the Holy Spirit given orders to the apostles whom He had chosen.
 - **Romans 10:4** Christ is the end fulfillment {i.e., paid in full} of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.
 - Galatians 4:19 My children My sons and daughters, with for whom I am again in labor until Christ is formed in you
- 43 And Peter stayed many days in Joppa with a tanner named Simon.
