Joao:

The most efficient investment one can make for language facility is to study linguistics.

In the case of the Greek text and the apparatus, 2 semesters of linguistics would enable one to understand the sense of a given apparatus and to be able to follow the Greek text and understand the main points with the aid of a dictionary.

After 4 semesters of linguistics, one would be able to understand the entire apparatus and to read with some facility the entire Greek text with occasional reference to a dictionary.

In a broader sense, a knowledge of linguistics greatly facilitates the ability to be proficient in any language!

If at all possible, the systematic study of Classical Greek (as opposed to "koine Greek", which is not even a real language), even for one semester would be of enormous benefit.

The best dictionary of which I am aware, and fortunately is available online is the Greek Lexicon - Perseus Digital Library - Tufts University:

The definitions provided draw on a database of hundreds of years of Classical Greek literature.

I definitely do not recommend Vine's or Strong's. Both of them take great liberties with the definitions of the words. Both make "implications" about the word meanings. Their implications are normally completely gratuitous and very legalistic.
